### Improving Tier 1 Expectations and Instruction

#### Begin with PBIS

- Strengthen Schoolwide PBIS
- Team meets twice per month
- Incorporate more intensive supports and strategies into Tier 1 to improve support for all students.
- Create behavior management flowchart

#### Professional Development

- Snacks for Strats / PD Days
- Analyzing and Interpreting Data (September)
- Organizing a MTSS through Effective Practices Session 1 (October)
- Organizing a MTSS through Effective Practices Session 2 (April)



### Improving Tier 2 Behavioral Intervention Delivery

#### Develop MTSS Intervention Resource Map and Flowchart

- Identifies data sources to determine students in need of interventions
- Identifies intervention and progress monitoring tools based on common need

# Develop and Implement Check-in, Check-out (CICO) for students receiving a high number of discipline referrals

- Daily collection of behavioral data aligned with PBIS expectations
- Daily check-in with student and check-out to review behavioral data

#### Groups with Behavior Specialist

- Aligned with PBIS Expectations
- Created and executed SEL lesson plans for students that needed Tier 2 and 3 Interventions with the Behavior Specialist

### Improvements and Updates in 22-23

Goal: Analyze discipline data trends and establish a culture focused on effectively communicating and enforcing schoolwide and classroom expectations for the upcoming school year.

- Created and executed focused grade level presentations
- Created visible signage in hallways, classrooms, news, etc.
- Held students accountable on campus and within classrooms by connecting behaviors to expectations.





# Hacks for Success Behavior & Academics





### Hack #1: Develop Cultural Expectations

- Created campus wide behavioral and performance expectations
  - Be Safe
  - Be Respectful
  - Be Responsible
- Celebrate Staff and Students
  - Quarterly PBIS Celebrations
  - Staff Breakfasts and Barbeques
  - Department of the Month Luncheon
- PBIS Leadership Class
  - Student PBIS Representatives + PBIS Campus Coordinator
  - Review Data and Make Recommendations for Improvement





## Venice High School Climate and Culture











### **PBIS Leadership Class**

**Analyze Data:** Students review attendance and behavior data to identify key areas needing improvement each quarter.

**Set Goals:** Establish specific goals based on the identified areas for improvement.

**Develop Strategies:** Create actionable plans and strategies to address the areas needing improvement.

**Monitor Progress:** Regularly track and review progress towards the set goals.

**Celebrate Achievements:** Plan and organize quarterly celebrations to recognize and reward progress in the targeted areas.




### **Behavior Heat Maps & Data Visualization**

**Identify Issues:** Quickly visualize patterns and hotspots to target interventions.

Enhance Decisions: Facilitate data-driven decisions and resource allocation.

**Monitor Progress:** Track effectiveness and improve staff collaboration with clear visual data.





### Hack #3: Build school level systems first

- Campus-level PBIS Team
  - Organize CICO for 10-15 students
- Classroom Teacher Buy-in
  - Execute CICO
  - Expand
- Student Buy-in



# Implementation of Check-in Check-out: School Wide

Classroom Support	Implement direct support systems and reduce office referrals by addressing issues in classrooms at the school level, providing additional support to teachers.
Teacher Training	Provide professional development on classroom management and intervention strategies.
Consistent Practices	Establish and enforce consistent behavior expectations and intervention practices school-wide.
Positive Reinforcement	Focus on positive behavior reinforcement to improve school climate.
Collaborative Environment	Foster collaboration among teachers, support staff, and administration to address behavioral issues.



# Implementation of Check-in Check-out: What Happened Next

2021 2022 2023 2024



#### **MILESTONE 01**

Repeat offender behavior decreased as a result of CICO executed by outside of classroom support staff.

#### **MILESTONE 02**

Teachers became more aware of their own practices and the needs of students.

#### **MILESTONE 03**

Students noticed that teachers changed their practices, environments and relationships grew, performance followed.




# Hack #4: Provide ongoing continuous professional learning

- Check-in Check-out Campus PD
- Ongoing data sharing and analysis
- Tiered Support Practices (ongoing)



### CICO Campus PD Plan - The PD Roadmap to Success

- Provided specific PD to CICO coordinators
- Creating a short video PD for ALL teachers
- Provided transparent PD sharing in weekly staff email.





# Hack #5: Collaborate at the school and district level

- The district identifies and codifies practices based on policy.
- These practices can often be perceived as compliance-driven.
- Schools and districts collaborate to implement high-quality practices that not only meet policy compliance but also align with the underlying rationale behind the policy.


